


## Early Childhood Scavenger Hunt






## Colors and Patterns in Nature Scavenger Hunt

## Questions to ask your child:

- 1. There are advantages to blending in, and many animals are camouflaged so that it is harder for a predator to see them. However, some animals are very easy to see. What advantages are there to being brightly colored? What disadvantages are there?
- 2. In nature, plants and animals exhibit different types of symmetry. Humans exhibit bilateral symmetry, meaning if you draw a line down the middle of our body from top to bottom, we have a left and a right half which are essentially the same. Can you think of other animals that have bilateral symmetry?

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
